Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference

The Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) was founded in 1972. During the two years previous to the GLIAC's founding, several attempts were made to create a new NCAA College Division conference. In 1971, the Great Lakes Athletic Conference was formed, but plans for the new conference were put on hold and several of the participating schools subsequently withdrew their support.

However, the idea for a new conference did not die, and since 1972-73 the GLIAC has been a leader in the advancement and promotion of intercollegiate athletics for men and women.

The charter members of the GLIAC were Ferris State University, Grand Valley State University, Lake Superior State University, Northwood University, and Saginaw Valley State University.

Expansion of the GLIAC began immediately with the addition of Oakland University in 1974. Hillsdale College and Northern Michigan University were accepted as members in 1975, while Wayne State University joined in 1976. In 1977, the conference lost its first member when Northern Michigan withdrew. Michigan Tech University filled the vacancy when it became a member in 1980.

After the 1986-87 season, Northwood left the conference and was replaced by Northern Michigan. Northwood rejoined the conference in 1992.

After the 1989 season, the conference dropped football as a sponsored sport. The conference schools sponsoring football joined the members of the Heartland Collegiate Conference in forming the football-only Midwest Intercollegiate Football Conference (MIFC), which began play in 1990.

After nine years of existence as one of the premier conferences in Division II football, the MIFC merged as part of GLIAC on July 1, 1999. With the merger, the University of Indianapolis became an associate member as a football-only school.

The GLIAC entered a new era in the 1995-96 school year. Prior to 1995-96, all member institutions of the GLIAC were located in the state of Michigan. On December 14, 1994, membership was offered to three schools located in Ohio and Pennsylvania. The expansion members were Ashland University of Ashland, Ohio, and Gannon University and Mercyhurst College, both located in Erie, Pa. All three schools began their membership July 1, 1995.

On July 1, 1997, membership was granted to The University of Findlay, located in Findlay, Ohio. Findlay replaced Oakland University, which withdrew from the conference after the 1996-97 season as it moved to NCAA Division I status.

Westminster College, located in New Wilmington, Pa., became the 14th member of the GLIAC when it accepted its expansion offer in May of 1997. On June 30, 2000 Westminster left the conference as it changed its affiliation to NCAA Division III.

Overall the GLIAC conducts championships in 21 sports, 11 for men and 10 for women. The policy-making body of the GLIAC is the Executive Council, which is comprised of three representatives from each member institution – its director of athletics, faculty athletics representative and senior woman administrator. Final approval of all GLIAC legislation is required by the Council of GLIAC Presidents.

The presidency of the GLIAC is rotated alphabetically by school, with Tom Kirinovic, director of athletics at Ferris State, serving as GLIAC President in 2004-05. Rob Fournier, director of athletics at Wayne State, will serve as Past President, and Steve Rackley, director of athletics at the University of Findlay, serving as President-Elect.

As GLIAC commissioner, Tom Brown is responsible for all conference administration. He is beginning his 14th season as the conference's fifth commissioner.

Head Coach Bernie Anderson



Bernie Anderson enters his first season at Northern Michigan University. He comes to NMU from Michigan Technological University where he had been the head coach of the MTU football program for 19 years (1987-05). He is MTU's all-time winningest gridiron mentor with 93 wins (93-96).

Anderson led the Huskies to their first-ever NCAA playoff tournament in 2004, and his 1999 and 2004 squads both completed the season rated among the Top 10 teams in NCAA Division II rankings.

"I have been very happy during my tenure at Michigan Tech, but rebuilding the NMU program holds a special appeal for me as an alum and as a native of (nearby) Ishpeming," said Anderson. "Michigan Tech has been great to me, but I feel that if I'm ever going to make a career change, now is the time. The NMU position is one of few that would motivate me to leave Tech."

"Some may say that NMU recruited Bernie away from Tech, but in reality this is a homecoming and a matter of timing. Bernie has always stayed in touch with the NMU program – even more so in the last year since his son Brad came to play here – and Bernie is ready for a new challenge. He is an experienced, successful, and well-respected coach. He also understands NMU's strong football tradition, and he is someone we believe can lead us back to the level of play we are committed to as an institution," said Ken Godfrey, the NMU athletic director.

As a prep player, Anderson was a standout in football, track and wrestling at Ishpeming High School. In wrestling, he was a three-time Upper Peninsula champion who compiled a 78-5-1 record. He was also a two-time all-conference football player.

As an NMU collegian, Anderson earned NCAA All-America honors as a Wildcat wrestler in the 132-pound weight division in 1976. He was 72-30-2 during his four-year career.

He graduated from Northern in 1978 with a bachelor's degree in secondary education. In 1984, he completed a master's degree at NMU.

Following graduation of his undergraduate degree, Anderson began a teaching career at his prep alma mater where he was served as defensive coordinator for a football program that went 11-1 and won the 1979 Michigan State High School Championship.

He was then head coach at Three Lakes, (Wis.) High School where he posted a 25-8 mark. His 1982 squad went 13-1 and was the Wisconsin State High School playoff runner-up.

Anderson began his collegiate coaching career in 1983 as an assistant at Western Michigan University. In 1984, he joined the MTU staff in the same capacity. Three years later, he was named the Huskies' head coach.

Anderson and wife, Vikki, have five children: Brook Spindler (husband Brad), Brad, Vanessa, Benjamin and Bailey. Vikki attended and played basketball at NMU.

Chadd Braine



Chadd Braine enters his first season at Northern Michigan University as the defensive coordinator. He was the linebackers coach at MTU for two seasons (2004-05).

Braine coached the defensive backs at the University of South Dakota during the 2003 season. For three seasons (2000-03) he was the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Ferrum College. He led the Ferrum team to an NCAA III top 10 ranking in total defense twice in his three-year stint.

Braine was a four-time letterwinner in track and field and football at East Stroudsburg University. He earned both a bachelor's (1999) and master's (2001) degree in health and physical education from ESU.

Braine will recruit Southeast Michigan.

Jeff Duvendeck



Jeff Duvendeck enters his first season at Northern Michigan University as the offensive coordinator. He spent three seasons (2003-05) at Michigan Tech University, where he was the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator.

While at Tech, Duvendeck coached three NCAA II All-Americans and two who were GLIAC Offensive Lineman of the Year.

A former running back at Central Michigan University, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in health promotion and rehabilitation in 2001.

Duvendeck spent the following season (2001) as a graduate assistant at Tiffin University working with the running backs. In 2002, he moved to Grand Valley State University as a graduate assistant working with the offensive line and helped the Lakers win a NCAA II National Championship.

He will recruit Michigan's lower peninsula.

Ethan Jeros



Ethan Jeros enters his first season at Northern Michigan University as the defensive front coach. He was the defensive ends coach at Virginia Military Institute during the 2005 season. Before his arrival in Lexington, Va., he was the defensive line coach at Muskingum College for two seasons (2003-04).

Jeros also was the defensive line coach at Marietta College for three seasons (2000-03).

Before entering the college coaching ranks, he was the defensive coordinator, linebackers and tights end coach at South Brunswick High School in South Brunswick, N.J. for three seasons (1998-00).

He was a two-time letterwinner at Marietta where he was a two-time selection to the All-Ohio Athletic Conference Team as a defensive tackle, and was named to *Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette* All-America Team as an honorable mention selection.

Jeros received both his bachelor's (1995) and master's degrees (2002) from Marietta.

Matt LaFleur enters his first season at Northern Michigan University as the quarterbacks coach.

LaFleur was a graduate assistant coach at Central Michigan University for two years (2004-05) working with the offense.

In 2003 he was an SVSU studentassistant coach, working with the wide receivers. LaFleur went on to play two years (2003-04) of professional football in the National Indoor Football League.

He graduated from Saginaw Valley State University in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in secondary education. At SVSU he was a three-time second-team All-GLIAC selection at quarterback.

In the classroom, LaFleur was a threetime selection to the All-GLIAC Academic Team

He is currently working on a master's degree at CMU in physical education.

Joe Ballard



Joe Ballard enters his first season on the Northern Michigan University football coaching staff. He will coach the running backs and assist with some special teams duties.

Ballard began his collegiate football career at Central Michigan University before transferring to Grand Valley State University. With the Lakers, Ballard played on two NCAA II National Championship Teams. During the 2005 season he started all 14 games at strong safety.

Ballard lettered three times at Chesaning Union High School where he graduated in 2000. He coached the wide receivers and the defensive backfield at Chesaning Union from 2003-04.

Ballard graduated from GVSU in 2006 with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice with an emphasis in probation/pre-law.

Vincent Mayfield



After a stellar career with the Wildcats, Vincent Mayfield enters his first year as an NMU football coach. He will coach the wide receivers.

Mayfield lettered four times with the Wildcats. He was a two-time First Team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) selection. Mayfield led the GLIAC in 2005 in receptions/game, all-purpose yards and was second in receiving yards/game. He ended his NMU career with 238 receptions for 2,774 yards and 19 touchdowns. Mayfield set an NMU career record for most receptions. He also set NMU game records for most receptions (15) and most yards (255). Mayfield was selected MVP of team after his junior and senior seasons.

He is currently completing his bachelor's degree work in physical education at NMU.

Matt Bush



Matt Bush enters his second season on the Northern Michigan University football coaching staff. During the 2005 season he coached the running backs and this season he will direct the alley players on defense

Bush was a member of the NMU football team from 1998-02 where he was a tight end and long snapper. Bush was a four-time letterwinner for the Wildcats. During the 2002 season, Bush hauled in 13 passes for 199 yards a touchdown.

for 199 yards a touchdown.

The Interlochen, Mich. native was a two-time letterwinner at Traverse City West High School. He was selected to the Big North and Great Lakes All-Conference teams. Bush coached the defensive ends and long snappers at Traverse City West during the 2003 and 2004 football seasons.

Bush earned his bachelor's degree from NMU in criminal justice in 2003. He is currently working on his master's degree at NMU in criminal justice.

Tom Wender



Tom Wender enters his first season on the Northern Michigan University football staff. He will coach the linebackers.

Wender spent the 2005 season at Saginaw Valley State University as the special teams coordinator/outside linebackers coach. He spent 21 seasons (1984-04) at Iron Mountain High School, where he was the head football coach. Wender compiled an overall record of 170-55 with the Mountaineers. He led his teams to 15 playoff appearances, 11 Mid-Peninsula Conference championships, three state finals appearances and two state titles in 1993 and 2000. Wender retired after the 2004 season

He is a 1968 graduate of Kingsford High School and earned his NMU bachelor's degree in industrial arts in 1972.







2006 Outlook



A familiar face will be roaming the Northern Michigan University sideline this season. Bernie Anderson, the former head coach at Michigan Tech, takes over the reins from Doug Sams who has moved on to Stanford University. The Wildcats are coming off a 2-8 overall and Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) campaign in 2005. Anderson roamed the sidelines for the Huskies for 19 seasons. NMU has not had a winning season since going 6-5 in 2002.

A new coaching staff brings in new ideas. "The big thing is that our players play with some confidence and discipline," Anderson said. "There is a learning curve here. If we can come out and stay together, I think we will be in OK shape."

NMU tied with Findlay and Mercyhurst for 11th in the GLIAC standings after the 2005 campaign. Scoring was not the problem for the 'Cats as they averaged 23.1 points a game for the season, which ranked the team sixth in the GLIAC. But NMU was 13th in the conference in scoring defense (39.4 points a game). The 'Cats did drop two overtime games in 2005 as they lost to Findlay (37-40) and Gannon (23-26), which were both on the road.

Buddy Rivera who led the 'Cats offense until the suffering a leg injury in the next to last game of the season against Grand Valley State is expected to be back to form when drills open in August. He was a Second Team All-GLIAC selection in 2005 as NMU was second in the conference in pass offense (246.8 yards/game). Rivera finished the 2005 campaign ranked second in the GLIAC in passing by averaging 239.0 yards/game. He did lead the GLIAC in total offense by averaging 284.0 yards/game. Rivera was third in the conference in 2005 in pass efficiency with a 135.6 efficiency rating.

Gone is Rivera's favorite target, Vincent Mayfield. He led the GLIAC in receptions/game in 2005 with almost seven catches a game. Mayfield ended the campaign with 69 receptions for 898 yards with six touchdowns. He led the GLIAC in all-purpose yards with 1,429 yards. Mayfield set new NMU records for most receptions in a career (238) and most receiving yards in a game (255). Fred Wells, was second on the team in 2005 in receiving with 32 receptions for 411 yards is back for 2006. He hauled in two TD passes. Newcomers Greg Raspberry, Dan Elmore and Paul Kraemer

could work their way into being a leaders in receptions. Kraemer had 20 catches for 226 yards and a TD in 2005. Elmore hauled in nine passes for 115 yards.

The backfield will see a two-back set in Anderson's offense. Brad Anderson, who led the 'Cats on the ground in 2005 with 561 yards on 127 carries leads the way. He had a team-high five TDs on the ground. Rivera was second on the team on the ground last season with 405 yards on 110 carries. He had three rushing touchdowns. Joe Poehls gets the early nod at fullback.

The offensive line has a couple holes to fill in 2006. Robert Boss, Greg Frankenfield and Eric Duchaj are gone from last year. Along the line for the 'Cats are Kris Krempien who moves over to left tackle from the right side. Central Michigan University transfer, Brian Jenerou, will open the season at left guard. Seth Arbogast, who saw time in 2005 at center is out for the season. Cody Hanson has the early nod at center. Along the right side of the line Dan Ryan will be at guard while Jack Rustman is at tackle. "We have a young offensive line that will go through some growing pains," Anderson said.

The other side of the ball, the defense will have a new look. Look for Lamont Bender and Tyler Larson to open up the season at the end spots. Larson was fourth on the team in total tackles in 2005 with 55 (32 solo and 23 assisted). He did have seven tackles-for-loss (-42 yards) and four sacks (-32 yards). Bender ended the 2005 campaign with four total tackles. Inside the defensive front at the tackle position the early edge goes to Mike Mahloch. Mahloch started eight games last year at tackle and ended the season with 31 total tackles. He had five-and-ahalf tackles-for-loss (-15 yards) and a sack (-2 yards).

Jim Couretas, a Second Team All-GLIAC selection, was supposed to anchor the linebacking corps, but is out for the season with an injury. He led the 2005 'Cats with 110 total tackles (59 solo and 51 assisted). He also added eight tacklesfor-loss (-28 yards) and three sacks (-12 yards). Jeremy Nelson, Nathan Yelk, Joe Dost, Nicholas Bloch and Eric Mason have the early depth chart nod. Nelson had 19 total tackles in 2005 (10 solo and nine assisted). Bloch last year tallied 15 solo and 17 assisted tackles for 32 total. He had two-and-a-half tackles for loss (-15 yards), two sacks (-11 yards) and two

interceptions. Yelk accounted for 29 total tackles (18 solo and 11 assisted), two-and-a-half tackles for loss (-16 yards) and two sacks (-14 yards). As a team NMU had seven interceptions for 2005. Mason was in the top five in total tackles in 2005 with 48 (31 solo and 17 assisted).

Three veterans will be in the defensive backfield. Aaron Tillman, Arthur Scott and Jon Hoggard look to open the season in the secondary. Tillman and Scott both started in 2005. Tillman had 45 total tackles in 2005 (28 solo and 17 assisted) with an interception. Scott tallied eight total tackles (three solo and five assisted). Hoggard registered 16 solo and five assisted tackles (21 total tackles) last season with an interception.

"I think our personnel with a few exceptions here and there are pretty solid," Anderson said. "I would expect the defense to be improved on their side of the ball."

Kyle Marotz and his leg have departed. Marotz handled the field goal and point-after-touchdown duties in 2005. Marotz was perfect on all 13 of his PATs and was 14-of-16 in field goals. Thomas Labuz handled the punting duties last year as he averaged almost 35 yards a punt. He could be looked to handle all the kicking in 2006. Yelk handled some of the kicking duties last year when Marotz was injured. He was 4-8 in PATs and averaged over 54 yards on kickoffs.

The GLIAC race could come down to the defending NCAA II National Champions Grand Valley State Lakers, Saginaw Valley or Northwood. A couple of more wins and NMU could be in the middle of the pack.

Anderson's first year at the helm of the 'Cats may be challenging, but the pieces are in place for a turnaround. It is the same story for the 'Cats as they have to find a way to stop opponents from scoring and the offense still must produce. If NMU can accomplish those two areas then they could move up in the GLIAC race.







The University: A four-year, public, coeducational university founded in 1899, we offer learning opportunities to approximately 9,700 undergraduate students. Each incoming student is equipped with an IBM ThinkPad®.

Location: NMU is located in an environment unrivaled by any other, on the south shore of Lake Superior in Marquette, Mich., a town with breathtaking vistas and 23,000 lucky residents.

Campus: Our campus is wired to state-of-the-art technology and the Internet. We're large enough to offer scenic spaces and 50 quality facilities, such as: high-end specialty computer labs, a learning resource center; a theatre; a speech and hearing clinic; a student art gallery; a University museum; two on-campus radio stations; a public TV station; an observatory; an ice rink; a swimming pool; a rock-climbing wall; a diving tank; the Jacobetti Center for technical programs; the Berry Events Center; and the Superior Dome, an 8,000-seat stadium (the largest wooden dome in the world). But, we're still small enough to keep everything within walking distance (which is especially nice in the winter).



The 2000-01 academic year saw the implementation of the TLC (Teaching, Learning, and Communication) Initiative on the NMU campus. The TLC Initiative placed an IBM ThinkPad computer into the hands of every student to help them compete in the global market after graduation.

Faculty: NMU has talented faculty members, 80 percent of whom hold doctorates or the highest degrees in their fields, and a low student-faculty ratio of 20-to-1. Our average class size is 23, our average lab size is 16, and our average seminar size is 10. Of all entry-level courses, 93 percent are taught by career faculty.

Residence Halls: NMU's eight residence halls are organized into living areas – called "houses" – which include 40 to 45 students who actively shape their own living environments. Four students share a suite (two bedrooms and a bathroom), and all residence halls have great locations within five minutes of eating, learning, and studying areas.



Extracurricular: Along with all our natural wonders, you'll discover 200 clubs and organizations on campus, including academic, service, social, professional, religious, and special interest groups. We also have a full program of intramural athletics.

Intercollegiate Athletics: NMU is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) and the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA). Varsity teams for women include: basketball, cross country, Nordic skiing, soccer, swimming and diving, track and volleyball. Varsity teams for the men include: basketball, football, golf, hockey, and Nordic skiing. All sports are NCAA II, except ice hockey, which is NCAA I.

Olympic Education Center: Northern Michigan University is designated as the only United States Olympic Education Center by the U.S. Olympic Committee. Olympic athletes in boxing, Greco-Roman wrestling, short-track speedskating, Naturbahn luge, Nordic skiing, and biathlon train for elite international competitions while pursuing their educations at NMU and Marquette High School.

Cost: NMU operates under a "flat rate" tuition plan where students who enroll in 12 to 18 credits per semester pay one rate. The 2006-07 flat rate for Michigan residents is \$3,070 per semester (\$6,140 per academic year with fees). The rate for non-Michigan residents is \$5,038 per semester (\$10,076 per academic year with fees).

NMU on the World Wide Web:

Financial Aid: 80 percent of our students share nearly \$50 million in financial aid, and our average financial aid package is more than \$7,000 per student. Students receive aid based on need or merit through scholarships, grants, loans, or employment.

The Superior Dome has been home to the Wildcat football team since 1991 and is the finest football facility in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, if not all of NCAA Division II.

The Dome stands 14 stories high, and encompasses 5.1 acres under its roof. Constructed of 781 Douglas Fir Beams and 108.5 miles of fir decking, the Dome has a permanent

seating capacity of 8,000, but the building can hold as many as 16,000 people. The facility features a diameter of 536 feet, and has the ability to withstand 60 pounds per square foot of snow and 80 mile per hour winds.

The Dome features a retractable artificial turf carpet, the largest of its kind in the world. When it is extended, the turf has the ability to accommodate football, soccer, and field hockey. Underneath the carpet is a synthetic playing surface that features three basketball/volleyball courts, two tennis courts, and a 200-meter track. The carpet is extended over a cushion of air and by 12 computerized winches and takes 30 minutes to retract. Full setup of the turf is completed in approximately two hours.

BERRY EVENTS CENTER

The home of the NMU hockey and basketball teams, the

Berry Events Center opened its doors in October 1999.

The facility provides individual seating for approximately 3,800 fans, in addition to 16 luxury boxes, which

includes a President's Suite. Along the perimeter of the arena are four large concession areas as well as standing room for approximately 400 fans.

When used for hockey, the BEC has an Olympic-size ice sheet measuring 200' by 100'. When rigged for basketball, the court sits on a protective flooring, which is placed over the ice, and seating for 500 fans is available courtside. Conversion from hockey to basketball can be completed in approximately five hours.

The Berry Events Center also features locker rooms and support areas for the men's and women's basketball teams and the United States Short Track Speedskating Team along with four general-use locker rooms. In addition, skate rental and changing areas are located on the lower level of the complex.

The hockey area includes a weight room, athletic training room, meeting rooms, locker room, and support area.

Also designed to host concerts and community events, the Berry Events Center is equipped with moveable theatrical rigging and lighting.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION INSTRUCTIONAL FACILITY

The PEIF, as it is more commonly called, was opened in 1976 and houses the PEIF Pool, home of NMU swimming

and diving team, and Vandament Arena, where the nationallyranked Wildcat volleyball team plays.

The PEIF Pool features eight lanes and a diving tank with one- and three-meter

springboards, as well as a 20-meter platform.

Vandament Arena, opened in 1995 and dedicated in 1997, is a 1,500-seat volleyball-only facility, one of the finest in Division II.

The PEIF also houses a two-level Recreation Center, opened in December 1999, which is complete with a climbing wall, weight room, cardiovascular area, two basketball courts, a tennis court, two lounge areas, and a conference room. Also located in the PEIF are seven racquetball courts, a dance studio, athletic training facilities, locker rooms, classrooms, and staff offices.

The facility also houses an auxiliary gymnasium that the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams use for practice.
